Giving our young citizens a voice, July 2020

We think that all our young citizens should have the opportunity to learn about – and get involved in – local democracy and civic life. Earlier this year we were excited to announce our new <u>Democracy Friendly Schools</u> programme and to start receiving expressions of interest from schools across Kirklees who want to take part. Since then, lots has changed for our children, young people and school communities. It's a difficult time for everyone.

It's now more important than ever that our young citizens can have a voice in the things that affect their everyday lives. Understanding what local democracy is and how we can get involved really matters for all of us who want to have a say in what happens next. So with the support of our pilot schools, we're restarting our programme.

We are Democracy Pioneers

In March we were delighted to be named by NESTA as one of 19 Democracy Pioneers award winners, for our Democracy Friendly Schools programme. The award recognises organisations who are working in fresh and creative ways to shake up democracy and civic participation in the UK, to reconnect people meaningfully to democracy and help people to influence the issues that affect our everyday lives.

This is well deserved recognition for the pioneering work of our young citizens in Kirklees who are helping to make our schools Democracy Friendly. Two of our Young Commissioners, Evie and Vaneeza, collected the award. We've been sharing ideas with the other participants this summer.









Working with high schools in Kirklees

Also in March, we chose two pilot high schools to be the first to try out our programme. Since then we've been working on our planning and preparation, including putting the first version of our "train the trainer" pack together. After our unavoidable delay, we're now aiming to pilot this training in the week beginning 14th September.
